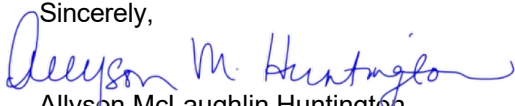

This office has redacted personal email addresses and telephone numbers pursuant to the Privacy Exemption of the Public Records Law, G.L. c. 4 § 7(26)(c). Certain commercial and/or financial were withheld pursuant to G.L. c. 4 § 7(26)(g) and G.L. c. 23I, § 3(l), which states as follows:

“Any documentary materials or data whatsoever made or received by any member or employee of the center and consisting of, or to the extent that such materials or data consist of, trade secrets or commercial or financial information regarding the operation of any business conducted by an applicant for any form of assistance which the center is empowered to render or regarding the competitive position of such applicant in a particular field of endeavor, shall not be deemed public records of the center and specifically shall not be subject to the provisions of Section 10 of chapter 66.”

Records responsive to this request are attached. The MLSC now considers this public records request closed.
